Youth Protection

For this month's roll call training, I have decided to touch on a couple of barriers to abuse within scouting. The BSA has adopted these policies to provide additional security for our members. They are primarily for the protection of our youth members, however, they also serve to protect our adult leaders from false accusations of abuse.

Two-deep leadership

Two registered adult leaders or one registered leader and a parent of a participant, one of whom must be 21 years of age or older, are required on all trips and outings. The chartered organization is responsible for ensuring that sufficient leadership is provided for all activities.

No one-on-one contact

One-on-one contact between adults and youth members is not permitted. In situations that require personal conferences, such as a Scoutmaster's conference, the meeting is to be conducted in view of other adults and youths.

Youth protection training will be held on Wednesday, November 3, 2004 at Saint Philip Presbyterian Church. Class will begin at 7:00 pm in the church library, which is located on the west end of the building. Please make arrangements for care. At the request of church staff, children will not be permitted to accompany their parents to youth protection training.

2005 Family Friends of Scouting Campaign

The Longhorn Council depends on the Friends of Scouting Campaign for 30% of its operating budget. A significant portion of that campaign comes from families enrolled in scouting (42% of the Friends of Scouting campaign). Currently 19% of scouting families provide support through tax deductible pledges and gifts to the Council. This funding is used to provide direct support to units through training classes, weekend activities, communication

services, monthly continuing education, advancement record-keeping and recruiting for new members and leaders. It is also used to develop community and council wide service projects and other efforts designed to enhance and extend scouting for the boy, the family, and the unit leaders.

Now is the time for unit leaders to start preparing their units for the 2005 FOS campaign. If you have not already scheduled your 2005 FOS presentation date (thumbs up to Packs 307, 320, and 333) please do so as soon as possible.

If you have a favorite presenter, please let me know and I will do my best to meet your request. I also need each unit to select a unit coordinator to work with my team to facilitate the presentation and follow up processes.

Our district met its 2004 goal (as well as 2003) and I would like to make it three in a row for 2005. As a re-chartering reminder, having scheduled your 2005 FOS presentation is a requirement to earn the Commissioner's Award, which

entitles a unit to free cloth rank advancement patches for a year.

For every 100 boys who join Scouting:

- 2 will become Eagle Scouts
- 17 will become future Scout Volunteers
- 12 will have their first contact with a church
- 1 will enter the Clergy
- 5 will earn their Church Award
- 18 will develop a lifelong hobby
- 8 will enter a vocation learned through the Merit Badge program
- 1 will use Scouting skills to save his own life
- 1 will use Scouting skills to save the life of another person
- RARELY will one be brought before the juvenile court system

Scouting's alumni record is equally impressive.

- 85% of Student Council Presidents were Scouts
- 89% of Senior Class Presidents were Scouts
- 80% of Junior Class Presidents were Scouts
- 71% of Football Captains were Scouts

Scouts also account for:

- 64% of Air Force Academy Graduates
- 68% of West Point Graduates
- 70% of Annapolis Graduates
- 72% of Rhodes Scholars
